

Rules for logo competition “Ready for innovative teaching?”

Institution

Erasmus+ association “Ready for innovative teaching?”

Objective of the competition

To choose a “logo” to represent the association. It will be for exclusive use by the institution.

Project

The Erasmus+ project “Ready for innovative teaching?” is a project focussing on teaching-learning methodology based on school curricula. It should help to improve teaching and learning based on and integrated in everyday life of students and teachers.

Topic for the logo

The topic should be a representation of any image (picture, drawing,...) that shows cultures, countries and school everyday life of participating schools.

Participants

All students taking part in the project can participate. They can do it individually or in small groups. Each country must present 2 logos chosen previously for the competition among those presented by students.

Technical details

1. The design must be original and not edited before.
2. The technique used can be free: drawing, painting, computer design, photography, all adaptable to printing.
3. They have to be presented in A4 and the dimension of the logo will be the maximum 15x15 cm, which does not imply that it should be a square shape.
4. The final design having been done on the computer, the electronic version must be presented in addition.
5. The logo may include some of the words “Ready for innovative teaching?”.
6. The proposal will be accompanied by a brief explanation in English of the design and the main ideas represented (written down on a separate paper).

Dates

By January 10th 2016 every school will have chosen their 2 winner logos and must send them to the coordinator in electronic version. The final competition will take place in the meeting at Madeira in January, where the winner will be notified. Every participating school will bring the 2 winner logos laminated, one copy for each participating school (2x6) to Madeira.

Prize

The winner's logo will be edited on each country's website, mentioning the winner's name. It will also be published in the school magazine if possible. The winner will receive a common prize from the association.

Acceptance

The participation in the competition implies the acceptance of these terms, as well as the criteria and the judges' final decision.

Copyright

The designs of the presented logos must be unpublished and directly created for this competition.

Authorisation will be applied to those presented projects in this competition.

All the selected projects will be able to be reproduced and shown to the public.

In all cases mentioned before, reference to the authors of the designs should be made.

The authorisation implies that the publication will not generate any retribution, and the copyright will be given to the institution who organised the competition.
